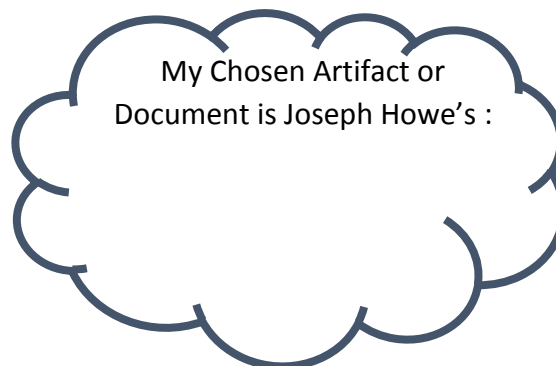
In February 2016 Nova Scotians will celebrate Joseph Howe for Heritage Day. What clues does your object provide about Joseph Howe? Where could you find out more?
